CEWiT Emerging Scholars Program	Undergraduate female students will participate in a technology related research program with faculty mentors across multiple disciplines, allowing them to build tech skills in any area of study.	\$50,000 minimum endowment \$3,000 annually (per student)
CEWiT Faculty Fellows Program	An endowed title will reward dedicated CEWiT Faculty Fellows to engage in research, best teaching practices, advocacy initiatives, and more across multiple disciplines.	\$350,000 minimum endowment \$15,000 annually (per faculty member)

TechSpace Collaboratory	An innovative, inclusive space will provide access to cutting-edge technologies and equipment in a comfortable, collaborative environment.	\$100,000 naming gift \$20,000 annually
Multimedia Marketing Campaign	Research shows that K-12 preparation and negative perception are <i>major challenges</i> that prevent women from building technical skills. An awareness campaign will attract women and “hook them early”, inspiring them to build a technology e-portfolio regardless of their major field of study.	\$250,000
CEWiT Annual Technology Summit Conference	This two-day conference provides learning opportunities and discussion forums for faculty, staff, alumnae, and students in a variety of technology skill levels.	\$750,000 endowment \$30,000 annually
CEWiT Leadership Development Program	Women will develop essential skills to advance careers in global leadership. Opportunities include intern leadership roles among tech-learning communities (coding, app development, web design, Black Women in Tech, etc.); national conferences; retreats; e-mentor programs; and job shadowing.	\$35,000 annually \$7,500 per student
